FROM THE COILE FAMILY

Beloved friends in the LORD and faithful supporters of FEMI,

It is with heavy hearts and deep sorrow that we share the news of the passing of our cherished husband and beloved father, Freddie Coile. On the early morning of September 1, 2024, Freddie passed from this world and into the loving embrace of our Savior. Even in his final days, Freddie remained steadfast in his passion for preaching the Gospel, embodying the very teachings he shared with us all that our purpose on earth is to serve the Lord and make Him known to those around us.

Even as he faced the battle with cancer, Freddie taught us that "when disaster strikes, even cancer, we don't need probabilities; we need certainties. Certainties that can only come from God." During these most difficult days that we have faced, we cling to the certainties given to us by God. Though Freddie is no longer with us in body, we find comfort in the assurance that he is present with the Lord (2 Corinthians 5:8). We hold fast to the hope offered through the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, knowing that we will see Freddie again-free from pain, cancer, and sorrow, in his glorified body. He isn't with us here, but instead, he is in the presence of the One he fixed his eyes upon (Hebrews 12:1-2). In Revelation 21:3-5, John writes, "And I heard a great voice out of heaven saying, Behold, the tabernacle of God is with men, and he will dwell with them, and they shall be his people, and God himself shall be with them, and be their God. And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes; and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain: for the former things are passed away. I will abide in thy tabernacle for ever: I will trust in the covert of thy wings. Selah." We will continue to seek refuge in the Rock of our faith, our Shelter, and Strong Tower.
